Offering amazing panoramic views, the course follows the links style of a traditional Scottish course on the front nine, while the back nine presents a rolling mountain valley layout.

Format: Scramble (Affiliates have the opportunity to create a team of RMGCSA members and compete against other teams. If participants do not have a handicap, they must submit average score and a handicap will be estimated. Each team will be allocated 60% of the total team handicap and will require two drives from each player be utilized. For those individuals that are not on a team, you can still play individual stroke play but will not be eiligible for prizes, or you can ask to be placed on a team if available.)

Directions: Take I-70 W to Silverthorne and take exit 205 for US-6 E toward Dillon. Keep left at the fork, following signs for US-6 E/Dillon. Turn

left onto Blue River Parkway/US-6 E and drive 6.2 miles. Turn right onto W. Keystone Road (Co Rd 8), drive 0.4 miles and turn right onto Soda Ridge Road (Co Rd 4). Continue for 1 mile and turn left onto Co Rd 169. Continue straight onto Co Rd 150/Keystone Ranch Rd. Drive 1.6 miles and veer left at the 3-way split to enter the parking lots.
